Math: In math we worked through a review sheet today. Monday we will have a test on order of operations and multiplication and division with decimals. Tuesday we will start on our unit on adding and subtracting fractions.



## Language Arts:

Students have been working on poetry this week. They have been looking at rhyme patterns and free verse. We have discussed how poetry can bring out emotion and connections. Next week we will be focusing on writing. Your child will be writing an informational essay on Jamestown.

**Spelling:** Spelling papers go home every Monday. Students need to write the spelling words twice on the front and complete the meaning on the back side. These papers are due back to school on Thursday.

AR: It is an expectation to read for 30 minutes each evening in order to reach the goal. Students are able to read five articles this marking period. They will also be reading a novel in class which they will be able to take a test on as well. Look for a new goal sheet to come home on Monday.

History: In history we are now studying colonization. We have studied the lost colony of Roanoke and have found out what happened to the lost colony. We also found out why so many people died starting the colony of Jamestown. We are currently studying the Plymouth colony and will study all the colonies of England and why they are important. We also will learn about other colonies in the Americas
